Summary of VAST PORTAL User Needs Workshop

Workshop held March 3, 2011. Attendees from Vancouver-area agencies; discussion of data needs of users, current PORTAL functionality, ideas for PORTAL enhancement.

PORTAL Interface Needs:


- Higher level of aggregation
 - Display and download values by hour of day for month, year
- Ability to select specific time period
 - Select start and end time (in addition to start and end date)
- Support for corridors
 - Plots and download for sub-corridors (similar to current highways plots)

PORTAL value-ads:

- Analysis of data from multiple source systems
- Query flexibility segments, time periods, resolution
- User notes ("wiki" comments, bad data, etc.)

Focus on:

- Display and download vehicle volumes by time of day for a month/year i.e. vehicle volumes from 4-5 PM for the year 2010 for a selected segment
- Gathering of context information and making it available
- Documentation
